

Cobb County School District (CCSD) looked for ways to more effectively communicate with it's community of over 800,000 citizens. SchoolBundle's Unified Communications Platform was the answer and solution to modernize CCSD's communication to one of the largest school districts in the country.

CORRECTING THE ISSUES AND MAINTAINING ACCESSIBILITY STANDARDS

Over 13,000 web pages – all requiring an update in design and to correct accessibility issues. These two pressing needs brought Cobb County to SchoolBundle. Looking at our previous work and the depth of our experience with school boards gave Cobb County confidence that we could provide the right look and feel for their new sites, but it was the attention to accessibility that is baked into our platform that helped finalize their decision.

For most schools in Cobb County, the school librarian is the one making changes and updates to the school's website. Managing the site is only one of the many tasks they have in a day; becoming an accessibility expert is an intensive process that would take training and time they just don't have. Cobb County knew they needed a solution that would not only provide an accessible UI without compromising design, but that would enable these already busy individuals to maintain that same level of accessibility.

SchoolBundle came out as the answer to this challenge for Cobb County. With a team well-versed in the ever-updating Accessibility guidelines, SchoolBundle provided Cobb county with a modern, easy-to-navigate design that didn't sacrifice accessibility to look good.

Maintenance also became a simple task for Cobb County users and webmasters; the SchoolBundle platform is built to include accessibility best-practices, such as link formatting and adding alt-text, right in the CMS. Without the SchoolBundle platform, Cobb County would have spent thousands of hours correcting accessibility issues and thousands more trying to maintain that level of accessibility and training their many users and webmasters to meet those guidelines.
